

4. Cost



5. Education Provider/RTO

Are you seeking a course that is nationally recognised, so interstate work is possible? What level of support do you require – chat room based or "real" people who are passionate about your progress in your studies?

Once you have reflected upon your education wish list, here are some questions to support you as you begin the process of choosing an RTO:

1 Research the RTOs and course options that provide the qualification you wish to study. Take time to read reviews of both the education provider and those who have studied your course. Check out their communities and socials, or better yet, seek a referral from a friend or someone who has studied at the RTO. The Australian Government "My Skills" website is a national directory of vocational education and training (VET) organisations and courses and is a great resource for searching for and comparing VET courses and training providers.





- 2 Contact the enrolments or customer service team and find out the following:
 - a. Is the organisation a Recognised Training Organisation? Get their RTO number to ensure the college is registered in Australia. This ensures they have met government guidelines and standards.
 - b. Ask to see their student handbook which contains their policies, including how to lodge assessments and seek a refund if you change your mind or want to swap a course.
 - c. Funding in writing, ask for options on how you can pay for your course.
 - d. Course brochures ask for copies of course brochures or look on their website.
- Website and social media pages: gain a feel for the RTO by immersing yourself in their community.
- 4 Ask to speak to one of their Educators if they say yes, then you know that they have a more tailored and hands-on approach to education.
